

LIVE GRANTS PROGRAMMES

Neighbourhood Renewal Small Grants Programme

The Neighbourhood Renewal Small Grants Programme provides grants of upto £10,000 for local voluntary and community groups who are carrying out activities in the following 10 areas:

- Bransholme East,
- Bransholme West,
- Longhill,
- Marfleet,
- Myton,
- Newington,
- Newland,
- Orchard Park and Greenwood,
- Southcoates East, and
- St Andrews

The Grants Programme is funded through the Neighbourhood Renewal Fund and the Safer and Stronger Communities Fund. This means that to be successful each application must demonstrate how it impacts upon one or more of the following floor targets/SSCF priorities:

- Substantially reduced mortality rates.
- Reduce crime.
- Raise the educational achievement of young people aged 11 to 16 years old.
- Increase the employment rate.
- Create cleaner safer areas, to develop greener public spaces and improve the quality of the built environment.

Wilberforce Small Grants

The Wilberforce 2007 Small Grants Programme is a source of funding for local community and voluntary groups. The aim of the programme is to help local communities be fully involved in the Wilberforce bicentenary activities, awareness of Hull's involvement in the abolition of the slave trade, its impact on the world, and its resonance with regard to human rights issues today.

Projects must show how they will do one or more of the following:

- Commemorate the bicentenary of the abolition of the slave trade
- Celebrate black history, arts and culture
- Support greater involvement of Black and Minority Ethnic groups in City life beyond 2007
- Improve tolerance and acceptance amongst the local community
- Encourage civic pride amongst the local community

Projects will also be expected to reflect the four values of the Wilberforce 2007 project which are Pride, Freedom, Belief and Change.

All applications for support must demonstrate clearly the potential benefit which could be gained by the community.
